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SAFEGUARD YOUR DEVICES AND DATA

October: Cybersecurity awareness month

In today's digital world, cyberattacks are unfortunately nothing new. Cyber criminals can attack on a multitude of levels, from large-scale attacks targeting corporations to smaller phishing attacks aimed to gain an individual's personal information.

October is Cybersecurity Awareness Month and this year's theme is "See Yourself in Cyber" – because we all have a part to play in cybersecurity. When we hear about massive data breaches, it can feel overwhelming and lead us to think we're powerless as individuals to stop cyber criminals.

The truth is, there are several practical steps we can take to safeguard our devices and data. Here are four easy ways to stay cyber secure:

ENABLE MULTI-FACTOR AUTHENTICATION.

Also known as two-step verification, multi-factor authentication adds a second step when logging into an account (to prove you are really you), which greatly increases the security of the account. This second step may be an extra PIN, answering an extra security question, a code received via email or a secure token. Regardless of the type of authentication, this additional step makes it twice as hard for cyber criminals to access your account.

USE STRONG PASSWORDS AND A PASSWORD MANAGER.

Remember, passwords are the "keys" to your personal home online. Your passwords should always be long, unique, and complex. Create passwords using at least 12 characters. Never reuse passwords. Use a combination of upper- and lower-case letters, numbers, and special characters. Consider using a password manager to store passwords easily and securely if you have a significant number of passwords.


Improve your cyber hygiene by doing these four things:

- 1. Enable multi-factor authentication
- Use strong passwords and a password manager
- Update software regularly
- Recognize and report phishing attacks

UPDATE SOFTWARE.

It may seem obvious, but regularly updating software is one of the easiest ways to keep your personal information secure. Most companies provide automatic updates and will send reminders so you can easily install the update.

If you're not receiving automatic software updates, set a reminder to do so quarterly. Be aware that some cyber criminals will send fake updates; these typically appear as a pop-up window when visiting a website. Use good judgment and always think before you click.



RECOGNIZE AND REPORT PHISHING ATTACKS.

Don't take the bait when cyber criminals go phishing. The signs of a phishing attack can be subtle, so take the extra time to thoroughly inspect emails. Most phishing emails include offers that are too good to be true, have an urgent or alarming tone, misspellings, ambiguous greetings, strange requests or an email address that doesn't match the company it's coming from. Cyber criminals are here to stay, but when we all take a risk-based approach to our cyber behavior, we're creating a safer internet for all.

FLOWERS ARE LIKE FRIENDS, THEY BRING COLOR TO YOUR WORLD For the love of flowers



Flowers are her passion – beautiful flowers, vibrant colored flowers, freshly cut flowers, hand-delivered flowers. Danette Johnson grows flowers - lots and lots of flowers! As you drive down the long winding lane to her home and flower fields, you will see sunflowers, zinnias, dahlias, snapdragons, gladiolus, and a wide array of other annuals and perennials. Having fields of fresh flowers at her fingertips allows Danette to be creative in her floral designs, and she enjoys showing the beauty that each season has to offer.

Danette and her husband, Daron, own and manage Nettie's Petals, a cut flower farm that sells seasonal flowers to florists, individuals, and at farmers markets in and around the Paxton area. What started as a hobby and a love of flowers for Danette, has blossomed into a thriving business that just keeps growing.

Daron wears many hats on the flower farm. By day he is a teacher at Paxton-Buckley-Loda Junior High School and when he's not teaching science to 8th graders, you will find him putting netting over the flowers to protect them, building a cooler to store flowers, and making deliveries. Both Daron and Danette consider themselves professional rock movers, as they move rocks around to hold down landscape fabric and frost cloth to safeguard the blooms and plants from harm.

Daron also enjoys tending to a flock of free-range chickens and guineas who make their home among the flower fields. Daron and Danette live on a farm that has been in Daron's family for over a century. The home they live in was built in 1918 and the surrounding land was corn and soybean fields farmed by Daron's father, Dennis Johnson, and grandparents, Paul and Ruby Johnson. Daron and Danette feel fortunate to be able live on the farm that has been in the family for over 100 years and continue the rich tradition of farming through their flower fields.

There are several other significant contributors to the success of Nettie's Petals. Danette's mom, Donna, can often be found tending to the flowers. She is a woman of purpose when it comes to eradicating the weeds that waggle their way into the flower beds. And the other family member who plays an important role on the flower farm is Esther, the family dog. She is the welcoming committee, property protector, and makes herself available if visitors need to pet a furry friend.

Danette is always open to planting new or unique flowers. Her customers often ask her to grow flowers that are difficult for them to acquire from wholesale distributors or that are extremely expensive. One of her most sought-after flowers is lisianthus, which looks like a rose, but last longer in the vase and is in great demand for bridal bouquets and other special-occasion flower arrangements. Nettie's Petals uses no chemical pesticides on their flowers. They do use an organic solution called neem oil. They pay close attention to soil composition and rotate planting different varieties in different areas to minimize insect infestation and maximize soil nutrient absorption.

Danette says she spends so much time in her flower gardens that she gets to know what's going on and can head off problems by paying close attention to the flowers, insects, fungus, and other changes happening in her floral oasis.

As Nettie's Petals business has expanded, Danette has extended her growing season. She has found that the beauty of planning around the seasons is that it doesn't matter about frost dates, you can grow an abundance of flowers that coincide with seasonal change. She finds something magical about experiencing changing seasons through flowers. She is much more present in the moment and connected to the seasonal shifts. Danette creates her bouquets based on what's in bloom and currently available. During the winter, Danette and Daron regroup and let the land rest. Their winter business is creating evergreen wreaths and greenery for decorations during the holidays. Starting in mid to late November, holiday wreaths can be purchased at Ruby Jewel Antiques and Gifts in Paxton. Nothing evokes the spirit of Christmas like the smell of fresh-cut pine branches and the beauty of the wreaths puts you in the holiday spirit.

Winter is also the perfect time to plan for the spring to come. The Johnsons use a breezeway in their home to start seedlings in February. They grow the seeds indoors and transplant to the ground in the spring.

People often ask Danette what her favorite flower is and she responds by saying that it is similar to naming your favorite child. She does have a soft spot for peonies and her flower farm has numerous peony bushes of various colors and types. Danette cuts her peony buds while they are still closed and stores them in the cooler until she needs them for an arrangement.

The Johnson's have come a long way from the first workshop they attended on small farms. It was a leap of faith for them to plant those first seeds of sunflowers, zinnias, and cosmos. Danette has started drying flowers and her sister, Darla Hill, is using them to create dried flower wreaths and arrangements. Nowadays Danette and Daron are also thinking ahead to future endeavors. They are considering hosting on-the-farm workshops where participants make memories while learning about flowers and floral arranging.

Nettie's Petals offers a local bouquet subscription. Danette loves delivering bouquets to customers. Witnessing the profound impact that a simple bouquet can have on a person amazes her.
