RIDER 2  
PURCHASED POWER COST ADJUSTMENT

Availability

This rider is applicable to all rate schedules.

Details

The purchased power cost adjustment (PCA) is an energy charge per kilowatt-hour (kWh) purchased by a member/owner, which is added to the member/owner's billing each month that reflects increases and decreases in the average cost of purchased power from the Cooperative's wholesale power supplier as recorded in Account 555.

Computation

The PCA value will be established each year concurrent with the review of the Cooperative's annual budget by the board of directors. The board will review the PCA amount monthly and make adjustments as necessary.

For all billing after April 15, 2013, the PCA value shall be based upon an average wholesale power cost of 7.59 cents per kWh purchased. The PCA value shall reflect the difference between 7.59 cents and the actual average wholesale power supply cost for the month divided by .925 to account for line loss. The PCA value will be determined to the nearest one-thousandth of a cent per kWh.
