PURCHASED POWER COST ADJUSTMENT  
RIDER 2

Availability

This rider is applicable to all rate schedules.

Details

The purchased power cost adjustment (PCA) is an energy charge per kilowatt-hour (kWh) purchased by a member/owner, which is added or subtracted to the member/owner's billing each month that reflects increases and decreases in the average cost of purchased power from the Cooperative's wholesale power supplier as recorded in Account 555.

Computation

The PCA value will be established each year concurrent with the review of the Cooperative's annual budget by the board of directors.

For all billing after March 15, 2021, the PCA shall be based upon an average wholesale power cost of 8.16 cents per kWh purchased. The PCA shall reflect the difference between 8.16cents and the actual average wholesale power supply cost divided by .925 to account for line loss. The PCA will be determined to the nearest one-thousandth of a cent per kWh. The board will review the PCA amount monthly and make adjustments as necessary.
